Rock Island County Health Department reports 1 death, 122 new cases of COVID-19 over 4 days

The Rock Island County Health Department is reporting the COVID-19 death of a woman in her 80s who had been hospitalized. Her death brings the total to 308 since the start of the pandemic.

"We are saddened that another resident has died from COVID-19 and we offer our condolences to her loved ones," said Nita Ludwig, administrator of the Rock Island County Health Department. "We urge everyone to get vaccinated as soon as they can. We expanded eligibility at our National Guard clinic in Milan to include everyone in Illinois who is 16 and older."

The health department also reports 122 new COVID-19 cases from Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. The total number of cases is now 13,626. Currently, 24 patients are hospitalized with COVID-19 in Rock Island County.

The new cases are:

- 8 women in their 50s
- 10 women in their 40s
- 8 women in their 30s
- 11 women in their 20s
- 4 women in their teens
- 4 girls in their teens
- 13 girls younger than 13
- 1 girl infant 1 or younger

No additional information regarding these cases is available due to federal privacy laws.
