Health department offering special child COVID-19 vaccination clinic this Saturday, opens all Friday pediatric COVID-19 clinics to walk-ins

The Rock Island County Health Department is working to make it easier for parents to get their children vaccinated against COVID-19 by offering a special clinic this Saturday and making vaccines available on Friday with no appointments needed at the department's offices, 2112 25th Ave., Rock Island.

The special Pfizer clinic this Saturday, Jan. 15, is from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. for children ages 5-17 for all doses, including boosters for children 12 and older who received their second dose at least five months ago. Children who recently tested positive for COVID-19 should be vaccinated 10 days after the onset of symptoms.

Starting Friday, Jan. 14, no appointments are needed for children ages 5-11 at the pediatric Pfizer clinic. Hours are 9 a.m. to noon and 1-4 p.m. The department expects that after-school hours will be popular, so families should expect a line. Social distancing and masking will be enforced. Families that previously made appointments for the Friday pediatric clinic should come at their sign-up times.

"We are trying to make vaccination as easy as possible for everyone," said Janet Hill, public information officer of the Rock Island County Health Department. "Cases are soaring throughout our community, including in our schools. Every school-age child is eligible to be vaccinated. Please take advantage of these opportunities so we all can get back to normal and end the pandemic.

"We all want our children to be able to stay in school. Vaccinated children do not need to quarantine after an exposure, unless they are symptomatic," Hill said. "Vaccinating children will keep them learning in classrooms where they thrive best."

This move to no appointments needed for children makes all Rock Island County Health Department COVID-19 clinics available on a walk-in basis. The department offers the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccine on Tuesdays and the Pfizer vaccine on Fridays. Hours for all clinics are 9 a.m. to noon and 1-4 p.m.

Other providers also are offering COVID-19 vaccines. Find your shot at vaccines.gov.

Vaccination is our best tool to end the pandemic, but we all most do our part by following other public health guidance:

- Staying home when you are sick and when you are awaiting test results.
- Wearing a face covering. A mandate from Illinois Gov. JB Pritzker requires that everyone 2 and older wear a mask in public indoor spaces, regardless of vaccination status. The CDC recommends that everyone age 2 and older wear a mask in counties of high or substantial transmission, which includes almost every county in the country.
- Keeping 6 feet of physical distance from others in public.
- Washing your hands frequently.
