Flu & COVID Vaccines

Every Tuesday through 10/22/24 – we will have walk-in Flu vaccine clinics from 8:30am-12pm & 1-4pm. No appointments are necessary for 12 years and up. Children ages 6 months-11 years old do require appointments. Appointments can be made for all other days by calling 309-794-7080.

RICHD currently has SPIKEVAX® for ages 12 and up 2024/2025 formulation & Moderna 6 months-11 years old 2024/2025 formulation. Supplies are limited at this time— call to schedule an appointment for your COVID vaccination at 309-794-7080.

There are programs in place for community members who are uninsured & underinsured.

During the months of June, July & August—72 COVID vaccinations were administered by the Rock Island County Health Department.





FDA Major Product Recalls

At the end of July, Boar's Head Provisions Co., Inc. based out of Virginia, recalled over 7 million pounds of ready-to-eat deli meat & poultry products. The plant was shut down indefinitely mid-September after being linked to a deadly *Listeria monocytogenes* outbreak. As of 9/27/24, there have been 59 human cases with hospitalization & 10 deaths reported across 19 states. Symptoms can include fever, muscle aches, headache, stiff neck, confusion, loss of balance and convulsions that are sometimes preceded by diarrhea or other gastrointestinal symptoms.

In early September, Milo's Poultry Farms, LLC., announced a voluntary recall on all carton sizes & types of eggs labeled with "Milo's Poultry Farms" and "Tony's Fresh Market". All cases of eggs for retail foodservice distribution with the brand names above were also recalled. The recall is due to possible contamination of Salmonella. These eggs were distributed in Wisconsin, Illinois & Michigan through retail stores & foodservice distributors. Production & distribution has been ceased at this time and will undergo appropriate testing & sanitization of the farms and processing equipment before resuming business.

2024 West Nile Virus Activity

(as of September 20th, 2024)

We have mosquito traps set out @ ~3-4 sites in Rock Island County that are monitored by an intern for the summer months. Here are a few statistics for IL and Rock Island County.

- 67/102 Illinois counties have tested Positive in humans, birds, mosquitoes and/or horses
- There have been 3 human deaths
- 41 Positive human cases in IL
- 45 Positive bird cases in IL
- 2 birds have tested Positive in Rock Island County
- 6 batches have tested Positive in Rock Island County

A deadly & rare mosquito-borne virus has reemerged in the northeastern states. Eastern equine encephalitis, known as EEE, has killed 2 people and sickened at least 11 others. Mosquitoes will survive until we have a hard frost. Remember to wear long sleeves & pants, use repellent and limit your time outdoors in the evening hours.
