Rock Island County Health Department reports 6 new cases of COVID-19 in 8 days

The Rock Island County Health Department reports six new cases of COVID-19 since our last report on June 28. The total number of cases is 15,010. Currently, one patient is hospitalized in the county with the virus. The number of deaths remains at 333.

Last week, the Rock Island County Health Department began releasing cases once a week. The typical day is Monday, but the report is being issued today because of the Fourth of July holiday.

The new cases are:

- 1 woman in her 60s
- 2 women in their 30s
- 3 women in their 20s

No additional information regarding these cases is available due to federal privacy laws.

Even though the number of cases of COVID-19 is much lower than in previous weeks and months, we all must continue to work to prevent further spread of COVID-19 by:

- Getting vaccinated as soon as you can. Visit vaccines.gov to find your shot. RICHD offers walk-in vaccines on Tuesdays (Moderna and Johnson & Johnson) and Fridays (Pfizer). The hours for both days are 9 a.m. to noon and 1-4 p.m.
- Staying home when you are sick
- Wearing a face covering if you have not been fully vaccinated
- Keeping 6 feet of physical distance from others in public if you have not been fully vaccinated
- Washing your hands frequently
